



## Earl of March Secondary School Extended French Certificate

Students in the French Immersion Program can earn an Extended French Certificate by accumulating 7 credits in French: four in the FSL courses, and three in other subjects in which French is the language of instruction. To earn the certificate, students must complete:

### All four *French as a Second Language (FSL)* immersion courses:

<b>Grade 9</b>	FIF 1D
<b>Grade 10</b>	FIF 2D
<b>Grade 11</b>	FIF 3U <b>or</b> FIF 3UH (Advanced Placement)
<b>Grade 12</b>	FIF 4U

### Plus three of the following immersion courses in other subjects:

#### Grade 9

BTT1OF	Information and Communication Technology in Business, Immersion
CGC1DF	Issues in Canadian Geography, Academic, Immersion
SNC1DF	Science, Academic, Immersion

#### Grade 10

CHC2DF	Canadian History since WWI, Academic, Immersion
CHV2OF/GLC2OF	Civics/Careers, Open, Immersion
SNC2DF	Science, Academic, Immersion
Co-op Immersion	Workplace experience in French environment (2 immersion credits)

#### Grade 11

CHW3MF	World History to end of 15th century, University/College, Immersion
GPP3OF	Leadership and Peer Support, Open, Immersion
HSP3UF	Intro to Anthro, Psych, and Sociology, University, Immersion
Co-op Immersion	Workplace experience in French environment (2 immersion credits)

#### Grade 12

Co-op Immersion	Workplace experience in French environment (2 immersion credits)
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*Students who switch to Core French part way through high school may still be granted the Extended French Certificate provided they have accumulated 7 French credits, 4 of which must be FSL courses.*
