School Year Calendar

Homeroom Class

On Monday, September 1st, you should receive an email from your child's homeroom teacher with start up information. On Tuesday, September 2nd, Students should come to the intermediate yard in the morning to line up with their class between 8:30-8:40 am

Attendance

Parents and Caregivers should report student absences in advance using the [safe arrival](#) mobile app, website, or toll-free phone line. These options are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Please ensure we have the updated contact information for you in our system.

Pick up and Drop Off

With construction ongoing, access to the main parking lot entryway will be from The Parkway as a right turn only. If you are arriving at Earl of March via Teron Road, then you will need to follow the route highlighted in the attached document until The Parkway is open again. The building entrance closest to the parking lot and directly next to the construction fencing will be closed and used for emergency exiting only.

For parents and caregivers dropping off their students via car, please keep in mind that our parking lot will be very busy at the beginning and end of the day. We have OC Transpo and Yellow School Buses loading on property as well as specialized vans. We need to prioritize access to parking and loading close to the main entrance of the school for these vehicles. Cars arriving at the end of the day for pick up will need to park in the parking lot and follow the traffic flow for cars indicated in the map below in **blue**.



Bicycles

Healthy and environmentally-responsible transportation is encouraged. We have bike racks located at the front of the school and on the side of the school next to the Intermediate yard facing the Mlacak Center. Students are encouraged to always secure their bikes with a sturdy lock affixed to the bike rack. Students should walk their bike when on school property and may not bring bicycles into the building. Bicycles must not be locked to fences, railings, signs or trees on school property.

Lockers

Homeroom teachers will assign each student a locker to use to hold their belongings. Please ensure that your student has a combination lock to keep their belongings safe. The lock must be used and stay locked throughout the day.

Nutrition Break/Recess/Cafeteria

Our daily schedule for students in grade 7 and 8 have two 40 minute nutrition breaks. Grade 7 students will spend the first half of the break outside for recess while the grade 8s will eat their lunch and snacks in their assigned classroom. The cafeteria will need to be used each day for our secondary students who are taking e-learning classes or have spare periods. Intermediate students will not be able to access the cafeteria to purchase food as the space will be used for secondary students only.

Personal Technology

We encourage students to leave phones and other technology at home. Phones and personal tablets, if they are at school, are kept in lockers and are not permitted in classrooms, hallways or the gymnasium (unless a student has a medical need).

School Supplies

School supplies are voluntary. The school will have supplies available for students. Families that prefer to purchase their own supplies may also do so. Whether or not a child brings supplies or uses the ones provided by the school, they will need to be stored in a pencil case for personal use.

Voluntary School Fee

The voluntary student fee of \$25 helps to subsidize Student Council activities, intramural sports, school-wide assemblies and class field trips. Information regarding the purchase of a 2025/26 yearbook will be distributed at a later time. Student fees can voluntarily be paid using School Cash Online.
